Minutes

- 1) Call to Order: Mr. Hammons called the meeting to order at 5:05 p.m. and welcomed everyone to a new year of School Advisory Council.

- 2) Opening Prayer was said by Fr. Gregory.
- 3) Approval of Minutes: There were no minutes to approve.
- 4) Principal Update: Mrs. Shannahan gave a brief update on In-Service week with the teachers. The teachers participated in the Monument PD Active Shooter exercise at the school, meetings and a team-building event at TopGolf, medical training, and training on Universal Design for Learning and i-Ready testing service. The teachers are working on UDL implementation in their lesson plans. I-Ready testing has begun and teachers will be diving into data in the coming weeks.
- 5) SAC Membership: Mr. Hammons explained that we were meeting to go over how many members would be on SAC for the upcoming year. Members looked over the by-laws for membership as well as the definitions of sub-committees.
- 6) Vice Chairperson and Secretary were appointed. Vice-Chair is Kyle Goodroe, and Secretary is Jayme Oakley.
